

WORKING ARRANGEMENT

**on the establishment of Operational Cooperation between
the European Agency for the Management of Operational Cooperation at the External
Borders of the Member States of the European Union(Frontex)**

and

the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Georgia.

The European Agency for the Management of Operational Cooperation at the External Borders of the Member States of the European Union (hereinafter Frontex) and the Ministry of Internal Affairs represented by the MIA Border Police of Georgia (hereinafter MIA Border Police of Georgia).

Proceeding from their aspiration to promote the development of operational/technical cooperation between Frontex and the MIA Border Police of Georgia,

Have arrived at the present arrangements on establishment operational cooperation with regard to the following basic principles, objectives, contents and organisation of the cooperation:

1. Basic principles

Frontex and the MIA Border Police of Georgia emphasis that the intended cooperation shall be developed gradually. The aim is to work towards a sustainable partnership.

2. Objectives

- (1) To counter irregular migration and related cross-border crime by means of border control.
- (2) To strengthen security at the borders between EU Member States and Georgia.
- (3) To develop good relations and mutual trust between border guard authorities of the EU Member States and Georgia.
- (4) To facilitate measures taken by Frontex and the MIA Border Police of Georgia.

3. Contents

- (1) Development of activities in the field of information exchange and risk analyses aiming to improve the efficiency of border control at the borders between EU Member States and Georgia.
- (2) Development of activities in the field of training as well as in the field of research and development related to border management.
- (3) Coordination of certain joint operational measures and pilot projects for maintaining and improving border control between EU Member States and Georgia, as well as technical improvement of these measures.
- (4) Active discussion on development at technical level of border procedures, aiming at more efficient border control, best practices, improvement of technical equipment and technological upgrading at the borders.
- (5) Improvement of the operational interoperability between the border guard organisations of the EU Member States and Georgia.

4. Organisation

- (1) A structured dialogue on the operational cooperation in border-related matters will be maintained between the Executive Director of Frontex and the Head of the MIA Border Police of Georgia.
- (2) Relevant contacts will be maintained via agreed Points of Contact (Annex). When necessary, expert working groups will be established with a view to consider specific issues and elaborate corresponding common recommendations.

5. Amendment of the working arrangement

This Working Arrangement can be amended on the basis of mutual consent of Frontex and the MIA Border Police of Georgia.

6. Financial aspects

The participation of MIA Border Police of Georgia in Frontex coordinated activities may be financed by Frontex under the terms and conditions applied by Frontex. Details of such terms and conditions must be agreed separately on a case by case basis.

7. Legal status

The present Working Arrangement shall not be considered as an international treaty. Practical implementation of its contents shall not be regarded as fulfillment of international obligations by the European Union and Georgia.
